Designed for 4 and 6 tire **Passenger Cars, SUVs, Pick-Ups**, and other **Light Trucks, Buses, RVs** and will also monitor **Trailers**.

Imagine monitoring a trailer from your cigarette lighter, or monitoring your tow-car from an RV, and then moving the plug-in Display to the car's cigarette lighter to monitor tire pressure while driving the car or SUV.

Imagine monitoring tire pressure in your car or light truck from your cigarette lighter, or from your RV when towing the car just by moving the Display module to the RV. With no wiring, no antennas, no signal boosters needed.

Just "Dial-in" your tire pressure on each Pressure Sensor, and plug the Display module into the cigarette lighter plug and your ready to monitor your tire pressure continuously and automatically.

You can even monitor many trailers and other tow-vehicles with 4 or 6 tires. And with a dual plug adapter you can monitor both vehicles at the same time

There are 2 systems, model TMS-04RC monitors 4 tires, and model TMS-06RC will monitor 6 tires.

When a loss of tire pressure is detected in any tire, a wireless signal is sent to the Display module where it lights up that tire's position and gives you an audible beeping warning for 15 seconds. It repeats every 5 minutes, or until tire pressure is restored to its normal operating pressure.
